



VISIT TO BRAMPTON and CARLISLE, Wednesday, November 20th, 2019

The late Autumn excursion to Cumbria includes a guided tour of St Martin's, Brampton, preceded by coffee and scones at Lanercost. The church is unique in that it was designed by Pre-Raphaelite architect, Philip Webb, and has exquisite windows designed by Edward Burne-Jones, and manufactured by William Morris; it is a "must" for lovers of Art Nouveau. In Carlisle we will see the new touring exhibition, "Turner; the Northern Exposure". The artist frequently painted in the North West, producing dazzling masterpieces of light and colour from sketches made during his visits. Lunch is available in Tullie House, in the Cathedral's Buttery, or in one of the towns many eateries.
